Secretary's Report:

Motion made to accept the April minutes as published in the May SinePost as amended to show that the application for the recreation park was submitted to the Town of Pomfret, not Town of Putnam; seconded and carried.

Treasure's Report:

March Beginning Balance: \$8351.93; receipts – dues \$60; expenses – JOTA QSL card postage \$44.22, sevretary misc expenses \$28.93,edible arrangement for member \$45; ending balance: \$8293.78. Motion made to accept the April Treasurer's Report as read; seconded and carried.

Old Business:

- K1AGI reported that the Jog w/Judy event went well w/6 ops and a reported participation of ~650 persons. K1CSP suggested that we should be developing operation plans for these annual events to include basic info such as contacts, maps, route maps, checkpoints, etc to better assist net control operations.
- K1CSP advised that Kid's Day on 6/18 will be set up the same as was done for the BSA JOTA event, and which will be operational from 1PM to 7PM. K1CSP & W1EQ will be on WINY Radio on 6/2 to promote the event.

- KA1MPG advised that the application for use of the Pomfret Recreation Park for Field Day was approved by the town. Parking issues and options were discussed along with band assignments. KE1LI to bring his grille for the Saturday 6PM pot-luck meal. Menu items briefly discussed but will be essentially the same as last year's event. It was noted that this facility is non-alcoholic.
- The Woodstock Road Race was discussed and mentioned as a great opportunity for beginners. Enough members volunteered for the event during the meeting. Muster time will be 8:30AM. Ctc: KE1LI

- KB1JDX gave DMR brief, cited about 12 check-ins on the last TAC4 net. He and others plan to do DMR net on 1st Wed. of each month at 8:30PM.
- It was advised that Angel Ride still needs more volunteers for this year's event on 5/28 & 29. Ctc: N1CLV
- K1CSP advised that the wire antenna at the camp lodge needs to be fixed ASAP and have a surge arrestor (SA) & ground rod installed. KE1LI & K1NLX offered an SA for the project.
- K1NLX advised that someone will need to take over as editor of the SinePost, and chairperson of the annual fleamarket as he is no longer able to continue in these duties. KC1BLH volunteered to assume responsibility for the SinePost. Someone needs to step-up soon for the fleamarket as planning for next year's event starts in June and commitments formalized by end of August, latest. Ctc: K1NLX

A Special AngelRide Participation "Thank You"

Greetings!

Over Memorial Day weekend, CT ARES provided communications support to the 13th annual AngelRide. This two-day 135 mile charity bicycle ride raises funds to support the Hospital Outreach Program of Paul Newman's Hole in the Wall Gang Camp. The Camp provides a summer camp experience for children with life threatening illnesses like cancer and leukemia. The fundraising goal for this year's ride is \$700,000.

On Saturday nearly 200 riders traveled east from the Yale School of Music in Norfolk to the Hole in the Wall Gang Camp in Ashford. On Sunday morning another 100 riders joined for the trip from Ashford to the Mystic YMCA. The unseasonable hot and humid weather took its toll on Saturday with over 50 riders needing assistance from support vehicles dubbed WINGS.

We utilized both the KB1AEV linked repeater system and the CT-ARES DMR Network to provide administrative and emergency communications along the route where cell phone coverage is sketchy in many areas, especially Litchfield County. The net control station on Saturday was co-located in the Communications Information Center (CIC) at camp. On Sunday we deployed the Region 4 Mobile Communications Unit to the Mystic YMCA to serve as the net control station.

What is Field Day by Jon KA1MPG

Field Day is the largest amateur radio emergency preparation exercise in the United States. Every year around 30,000 amateur radio operators gather at locations across the country and operate for 24 hours straight under emergency conditions. The purpose of this event is to simulate conditions that would be found after a major disaster such as a hurricane or an earthquake. Ham radio clubs set up stations at remote locations where no facilities exist for normal radio operation. The clubs bring everything they need with them. This includes tents,





trailers, generators, and of course all of the radio equipment, antennas, and towers. We usually setup five or six stations.

Field Day is a contest. The purpose of the event is to contact as many stations as possible during a 24 hour period. This is done under difficult conditions. It is also practice for the relaying information that takes place during actual emergencies. Each station has information that it has to exchange with other stations.

Field Day is an educational experience. If you have never participated before there are plenty of club members who are more than willing to teach you everything they know about all aspects of Field Day and ham radio in general. For those that have never operated before this is a perfect

opportunity to get on the air for the first time. If you have never operated a contest before there are many experienced contesters who enjoy teaching the ins and outs of contesting. There will be other educational activities during the weekend.

Field Day is a huge social event. Hams get together and have fun and enjoy each other's company. There are usually many people just talking and hanging out at all hours. These are either hams that are there waiting for their turn to operate or people who come to Field Day just for the socializing

This year the Eastern Connecticut Amateur Radio Association will be holding field day at the Pomfret Recreation Park located at 576 Hampton Road (Route 97) in Pomfret Connecticut. Setup begins at 2 pm on Friday, June 24th and should last for several hours. We will need a lot of help to get the tents, antennas, and

other equipment setup. The contest portion of field day begins at 2 pm on Saturday the 25^{th} and runs for 24 hours straight. We will need a lot of relief operators during the entire 24 hours of the contest. If you can only help for an hour or two that would be a big help.

On Saturday evening at 6:00 pm the club will be having a potluck supper. All are welcome. If you can make a dish or a dessert item, please do so.

The gate at the entrance to the park will be locked from dusk to dawn. The lock will be a combination lock with the combination of 1472. Please bring the combination with you. We will be monitoring the repeater at all times if you need directions to the park or assistance with the lock.
